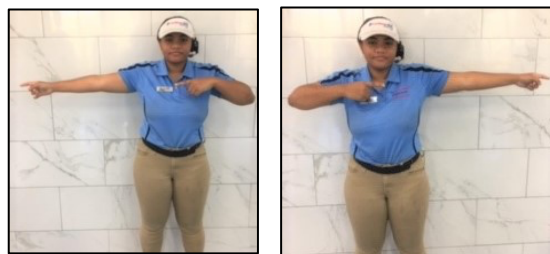
Hand Signals for the Directing of Vehicles

In order to maintain a professional and uniform standard, the following hand signals will be used whenever guiding a vehicle. Never combine directions together (e.g., forward and go left) Give only one direction at a time.

COME FORWARD – Using both arms, start with your arms lowered, palms facing up. Bending your forearms at the elbow, raise to an upright position. Repeat this up and down motion slowly, to instruct the driver to come forward. This movement must be done slowly, to let the driver know that they are also expected to move slowly.

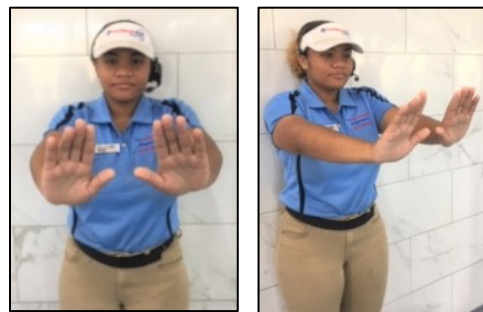


GO TO THE RIGHT OR LEFT – Extend your arm and point in the direction that the vehicle needs to go. Use your other arm by bending at the elbow, and also pointing in the same direction.



STOP – Extend both arms with palms facing out, until the vehicle has come to a complete stop.

Remember, the movement speed of your arms, will dictate the movement speed of the vehicle. Always provide directions in a slow deliberate manner. Abrupt movements or directional changes may also cause the driver to “jerk” in that direction, and may cause them to accidentally press the gas pedal and lurch towards the Loader. When any signal is in doubt or if there is any confusion on the part of the driver or Loader, simply motion the driver to STOP, re-evaluate the situation and begin slowly directing the driver again. Also, keep in mind that if needed, you can have the driver reverse a little, and start again.
